
City of Chicago Transit TIFs Fact Sheet

Overview of Red Purple Modernization Phase 1 (RPM1) Transit TIF

- Intended to fund transit improvements along CTA rail lines on the north side of Chicago and repay federal loans
- First Transit TIF in Illinois adopted by City Council November 30, 2016
- Located along CTA Red and Purple line tracks on the north side from North Ave to Devon Ave

Overview of Red Line Expansion (RLE) Transit TIF


- Intended to fund extension of the CTA Red line on the south side of Chicago to 134th Street
- Second Transit TIF in Illinois adopted by City Council December 27, 2022
- Located along CTA Red line tracks on the south side from Madison St to Pershing Rd



Transit TIF Revenue in 2022

TIF Revenue is calculated by multiplying the Incremental value in each TIF (the current taxable value of each TIF minus the base or "frozen" value of the TIF at the time of its inception) by the composite tax rate of the properties within each TIF.



Unique Statutory Rules for Transit TIFs

- May run for 35 years (rather than 23 years for traditional TIFs)
- No "blight" requirement (65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-8)
- A portion of Transit TIF revenues are distributed to other Taxing Districts in addition to annual tax levies:
 - 1. CPS receives their proportionate share of TIF revenue¹
 - 2. 80% of non-CPS portion is distributed to Transit TIF
 - 20% of non-CPS portion is distributed proportionally to other taxing districts



Transit TIF Tax Bills

A typical second installment property tax bill shows the breakdown of where your taxes go, including the portion, if any, going to TIF.

¹ CPS proportionate share of Transit TIF revenue is based on the annual tax rate for CPS compared to the total composite tax rate of all taxing districts servicing Transit TIF properties. (Example: 2022 CPS rate =3.757% and Chicago General Composite Rate = 7.035% making CPS 53.40% of the overall tax rate.)

For properties lying within the Red Purple Modernization Phase 1 (RPM1) Transit TIF, the amount of tax going directly to the TIF is displayed on Transit TIF second installment tax bills in the Municipality/ Township section of the bill and is listed as "City of Chicago – TIF Transit RPM1"

For properties lying within the Red Line Expansion (RLE) Transit TIF, the amount of tax going directly to the TIF is displayed on Transit TIF second installment tax bills in the Municipality/ Township section of the bill and is listed as "TIF Transity City of Chicago - RLE"

The statute authorizing Transit TIFs stipulates that part of the incremental revenue generated by the Transit TIF should go to other taxing districts. The amount directed to CPS is displayed on Transit TIF tax bills as "Board of Education – from Transit TIF" in the School Taxes section of the bill.

2022 Distribution of Transit TIF Revenue by Taxing District

The two Transit TIFs combined generated slightly less revenue for tax year 2022 than the Red Purple Modernization Phase 1 Transit TIF alone generated for tax year 2021. This is primarily due to the 2.6% reduction in the state-issued equalization factor in 2022 compared to 2021.
